2 A WORD FROM THE INTERIM PRESIDENT

Field opening:

As of June 8, we will be allowed to congregate at our field. Distancing must be observed, and please don't show up without a mask. You won't need to wear the mask all the time, but if we find ourselves in a situation where we are together talking, whether at the benches outside, or in the gazebo, we need to wear a mask. As you know, droplet inhalation is the primary way for Covid-19 to spread. Respect others, and wear a mask in these circumstances. A hand sanitizer is also highly recommended to bring along to the field, and avoid touching your face with unclean hands.

Chairs:

Another change you will see is that all the PVC chairs will be disposed of. If you want to bring a folding chair for yourself, that is fine, but don't leave it behind, or I will dispose of it. Also, refrain from using other people's chairs.

Trash:

YOU are responsible for your own trash. Maybe think about keeping a small trash bag in your car. We will not be having a trash bag on site.

Bylaws:

We will be working on the club bylaws soon to clear up some issues. We have a committee formed, and we should have things in line this summer. The intent is to change out tax status so that we can do online memberships.

Electrical power:

It's really high time that we get some power at the field. I have already spoken to David Grubb, who runs the Recreation Department. He has no problem with it, but needs to run everything through the Conservation Department. I don't expect this to be a real hurdle, just more of a formality. Once that is done, we need to find an electrician so that we can get an estimate, and bring it to a vote at a monthly meeting. So far, I plan to talk first to the electrician who installed the equipment at the bocce court and midway at the big field adjacent to the gazebo. More on this later...

6 FLYING TIPS

6.1 LiPo Killer Discharge – several contributors

Sometimes old LiPo batteries can cause serious problems. One way to insure that battery is dead is to discharge it fully. While some make their own, the guys in the club talked about an option that costs \$4.99.

6.2 Bringing a Dead LiPo Back To Life – Carefully! – Mel Suarez

Sometimes you drain a LiPo battery beyond the lower limit of what battery chargers will allow. And so, the battery charger refuses to charge it – normally a good thing as the battery could be damaged and a charge could cause a fire as many have found. However, if the battery is not puffy and quite new, it might not be a done deal. This video suggests charging on concrete which is what I did with mine. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=vusc1BFJX40

I ran one of my nice, new 2200 mah 3S LiPo's down to absolutely zero. I carefully placed it on a slow charge of 0.1C and NiMH setting until there was a bit of voltage. It only took about 5 minutes to get the voltage to where the LiPo charge setting would work.



7.1 EXPANDING THE ENVELOPE

Started working a bit (very, very little) on expanding the envelope. The Timber got me "back in the game" and the Pulse 15E is now definitely the "tool of choice" for some fun. So I dusted off my list of about 100 maneuvers and after doing a few, one caught my eye in particular, "Low, High-Alpha Inverted Pass". I had to first analyze what's involved in a high-alpha normal pass (i.e. lots of elevator, use of rudder and little aileron) so I could figure out that inverted high-alpha requires extending the down elevator when inverted. Simple thing, but unless you've tried it, it's not intuitive to the muscle-memory.

The list that I compiled, with help from Stephen Faust and Jim Orsborn, has been quite useful. Here's a snapshot of a page. What I've started to do is attempt to track what I can do on the simulator and what I've done at a flying field. See columns H and I. You can ignore columns C and D for now. Column E provides a reference to how the maneuver is done. The list has 91 entries at this time. Some may be duplicates. Here's the link to the latest list.
