4 TURBO MASTER NEARLY "BUYS THE FARM" - STEPHEN FAUST

Flying along minding my own business, pull vertical, pop top into an inverted flats spin, level off. Hear a squeal then an un-commanded reduction of power. Start the Rough Engine checklist (fly the airplane!). Seconds later all power quits so I switch to the Engine Failure checklist (fly the airplane!). As I setup for a emergency landing I see smoke trail and switch to the In-Flight Fire checklist (fly the airplane!). Then lots more smoke so I use the You're Going To Die checklist.

Landed off field, smoke and more smoke. Grabbed airplane to see smoke and flames in the engine bay. I thought it was the battery when it was in flight, but can see it was the ESC when I got to the airplane. All in all, very little damage. New ESC, some minor repairs on the motor mount where it was burned, and a new cowl from heat blistering.







A good start to the day as it got the adrenaline flowing better than my coffee did LOL

Yea, had full control.

I think the squeal was the motor stopping abruptly, it was that kind of noise.

Nothing, everything looked normal in the telemetry log right up until I unplugged the batts. I was hoping there would be a smoke icon at the failure point LOL



7.2 Don't Try This At Home! Death by Foamy

I looked up; my plane was in an epic dive at full-throttle! I pulled up and...nothing!!! Doughhhh!!!!

I've been getting back to airplanes after messing with drones for a few years. It hasn't been easy! Last Saturday I impaled my aerobatic plane – a foamy E-Flite Pulse-15e – a sweet plane, with great lines and a nice heritage, that barely fit in the back seat of my car all put together. Sigh...

Foamy planes, with powerful electric motors, I've discovered, are a different breed indeed. They don't weigh anything and so the thrust-to-weight is incredible when compared to the nitro days. But also, because they have little weight, there's no inertia to speak of, hardly. So, when you kill the thrust, they don't glide as well as you would expect – say for instance, in a wind. So landing is quite different also. You may have to keep the power up a little.

My problem was that my c.g. was way forward, even though I checked it before taking off. I must admit that I didn't put the canopy on when checking it but I doubt that it would have made much of a difference since it's light and sits pretty close to the c.g. I also must admit that I've been switching from 2200 to 3100 mah batteries that are much longer and heavier.

So, when I took off, I had it on medium rates and almost crashed into the trees at Middlesex R-C Fliers field. I nervously kicked in high rates and was able to pull up over the treetops...barely. So now I'm sitting on up elevator and flying crazy full-throttle patterns, while working the stupid trim tabs. My energy level is way high.

With drones there is no trimming to speak of typically. So, I'm out of "trim practice"...something I've been practicing on the simulator after the disaster to retrain this old brain a bit.

So, I'm screwing around with the trim and I look up and the plane is diving to the ground...FAST!!! In no time flat! Doughhh! I pull up with the elevator and nothing happens! Doughhhhhh again! For a split second, I realize, this is the end of this plane... Sigh...In it goes in, hard -- very hard -- to the point that the battery was nowhere to be found. The front end collapsed, the wing busted in half, the fuselage in half. The battery was in the weeds about 10 feet away from the impact. Dotty & Butch drove over and she is the one that found it.

So, notes to self:

- Don't panic when the airplane is behaving funny, and FLY THE PLANE!
- Don't fly full throttle when trimming.
- Get a better C.G. measurement tool (than one's fingers)
- Don't use dissimilar batteries as the c.g. may shift and mark where the battery should sit
- Make sure your trimming technique is practiced (with a sim or without) and intuitive



7.3 3 SCREENS!

Finally got 3 screens going on my full-scale sim. What a difference! I'm still quite unhappy with X-Plane...as good as it is. So different from the real experience. But a lot of that is setting it up and such, I'm sure.
