2 MEETING NOTES - JUNE THRU OCTOBER, 2022 - BY JERRY CROWLEY

2.1 DATE: JUNE 01, 2022

2. Safety: It has been noted that some pilots are flying "FPV" without the aid of a spotter.

Under no circumstances should this activity occur. As specified in AMA rules, when flying using FPV, a spotter capable of taking over controls and fly the aircraft safely and land it must be used.

From AMA: I will maintain visual contact of an RC model aircraft without enhancement other than corrective lenses prescribed to me. When using an advanced flight system, such as an autopilot, or flying First-Person View (FPV), I will comply with AMA's Advanced Flight System programming.

2. Operations, requirements, and limitations:

a) AMA FPV novice pilots must first be capable of flying their FPV sUAS without utilizing FPV.

b) AMA FPV novice pilots undergoing training with an experienced AMA FPV pilot should use a buddy-box system if practicing at a low altitude (below 100 feet) or practice at a safer, higher altitude when a buddy-box system is not an option.

c) AMA FPV pilots should perform preflight inspections of their FPV sUAS video, electronic control, power, and mechanical systems before each flight.

d) All FPV flights require an AMA FPV pilot to have an AMA FPV spotter next to him/her maintaining VLOS with the FPV sUAS throughout its flight.

e) The AMA FPV pilot must brief the AMA FPV spotter on the FPV spotter's duties, communications, and handover control procedures before FPV flight.

f) The AMA FPV spotter must communicate with the AMA FPV pilot to ensure that the FPV sUAS remains within VLOS, warn the FPV pilot of approaching aircraft, and when avoidance procedures are necessary.

g) During an FPV flight, the FPV spotter must be prepared to acquire the transmitter/control from the FPV pilot and assume VLOS control of the sUAS at any time safe operation of the flight is in question.

h) If an FPV pilot experiences a safety issue that does not appear to be a brief glitch, he or she must abandon FPV mode and fly VLOS.

i) FPV pilots must perform an RC test flight without FPV by conventional VLOS after installing a new FPV system and/or after any changes or repairs to essential flight systems.

j) UAS exceeding 55 pounds cannot use an FPV system for FPV flying.

k) FPV pilots may control the flight path of FPV sUAS with a standard gimbal RC transmitter or a smartphone, tablet, smartwatch, laptop, or proprietary controller with AP mission software using RF telemetry modules for the control link.

I) sUAS must operate on frequencies approved by the FCC for wireless video, radio control, and ground station telemetry systems. Some systems, because of power output or Amateur Band frequencies, will require FCC licensing (see AMA document #580 & #590).

4.1 PAUL'S CITABRIA This is a Citabria with a 91" wingspan. The manufacturer is unknown to me as it was an auction purchase. It originally had a 25cc SPE engine which, with Dan Micalizzi's help, ran perfectly. It would fly with the 25cc, but the plane clearly needed to swing a bigger prop. That engine is in the process of replacement with a 35cc Stinger engine which should be a big improvement. The recommended prop for the Stinger engine is a 19x8 vs a 16x8 for the SPE. This engine change should make a big difference in performance and in safety as it will help keep the plane away from things like trees.

After purchasing a receiver battery (and charger), and reviewing the servo movements, I discovered that the blade pitch was backwards.

After many hours of reading, consulting with HeliFreack.com, and looking at the manual, I realized the blades were installed backwards.


Now, it was time to give it a go. Charged everything up - the starter mechanism, the glow plug battery, and the receiver battery. Got the engine started! Yay! But for only 5 seconds. Turns out, the starter mechanism's wand – a 6" wand that goes into a one-way bearing – got fused into the bearing. Ouch! WTH! Had to leave the next day for the States. Oh well. I tried. Wrote a bunch of notes and gave it back to Dave. Hopefully he will find another heli guy to give him a hand.

Was impressed with how complex the head was. Not something I would want to maintain...compared to the flybarless setups of today.
